George Clooney joins forces with an impressive roster of activist-actresses to help fight discrimination against women in *Half the Sky, Turning Oppression into Opportunity for Women Worldwide*. “Women raise the chil-

dren, work the land,” says Clooney, who introduces the two-part special. “It’s not just that they’re important to society—they’re driving it.”

The documentary, which is based on the best-selling book by *New York*

Times columnist Nicholas Kristof and wife Sheryl WuDunn, follows Eva Mendes, Meg Ryan, Gabrielle Union, Diane Lane, America Ferrera and Olivia Wilde as they travel to 10 countries.

In India, Ferrera (*Ugly Betty*) witnessed a community of mother-and-daughter victims of forced-prostitution. “The hardest thing to take in was a lot of these women were trafficked into sex slavery at such young ages,” she says. Maternal mortality, gender-based violence, education and economic empowerment are also investigated through first-hand stories.

“I was overwhelmed by love,” says Wilde (*House*), recalling the self-sustaining village of women in Kenya who established their own beading business to become financially independent and fund their children’s education. “It is uplifting and empowering because we are focusing on a solution.”—Elizabeth Wagmeister
